The City of El Monte Public Works Department is currently in the process of reviewing and revising the Urban Water Management Plan (UWMP). This specific plan is prepared by all state urban water suppliers to support long-term resource planning and to ensure that there are ample and adequate water supplies available to meet existing and future water demands.

The assessment and analysis of the UWMP must be prepared every 5 years and submitted to the Department of Water Resources (DWR). The revised UWMP is required to be adopted by July 1, 2011 and must be submitted to the DWR by August 1, 2011. DWR reviews the submitted plan to insure completion of the report as identified in the UWMP Act (Division 6 Part 2.6 of the Water Code §10610 - 10656). A public hearing will be held on the draft revision of the UWMP. Please contact the Engineering Division if you would like to participate in the planning process. The City welcomes your participation during this process.

Per California Water Code:

Every urban water supplier required to prepare a plan pursuant to this part shall, at least 60 days prior to the public hearing on the plan required by Section 10642, notify any city or county within which the supplier provides water supplies that the urban water supplier will be reviewing the plan and considering amendments or changes to the plan. The urban water supplier may consult with, and obtain comments from, any city or county that receives notice pursuant to this subdivision (10621(b)).

- Provide documentation that “any city or county within which the supplier provides water supplies” was notified at least 60 days prior to the UWMP public hearing that the plan was being reviewed and changes were being considered.
- The supplier is not required to submit the revised plan to the cities or counties with this notification. The notification required is only that the plan is being reviewed.
- If Table 1 is included in the UWMP, indicate the agencies from which comments were received or where consultation occurred.
